Daimyo visited Keyo-in Temple and Kunozan Toshogu Shrine, then went back to Tokaido through this path.

There are tombs and material of folk heroes, such as Jirocho, Ohmasa and Komasa.

Ruins of a palace built for Tokugawa Ieyasu.

Believed to be the site of Fukuro castle, a naval base built by Takeda Shingen.

Rice made in Yamanashi were carried to Edo (Tokyo) by this Shimizu Bay.

Bound for S-PULSE DREAM PLAZA

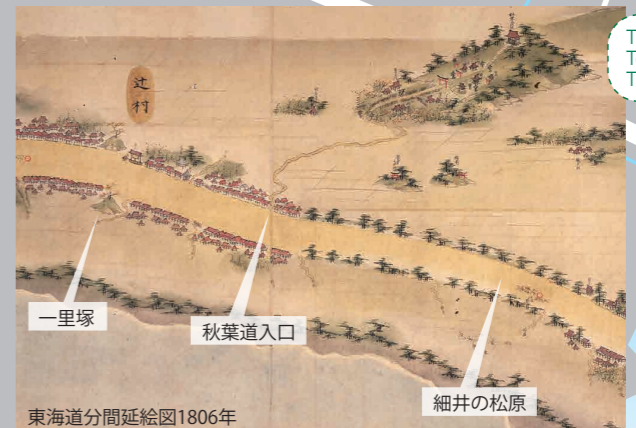
It is a way to visit Miho Shrine by ships. We can use water-bus nowadays.

There used to be pines lining the Tokaido Road. There are still some pine trees in spots.
